The goal is to expose students early on in their careers to research and global programs.

The IRAP starts during the Spring 2020 term with an orientation and training workshop. The highlight of the program is a 2-week course in Yucatan with TAMU students, where will take an introduction class on research, visit research centers of SIIDETEY members and have some tour to cultural areas that includes Uxmal, Chichen Itzá, Haciendas & Cenotes.

After that 2 weeks, students will join an online learning community and write a research proposal about a research problem identified in Yucatan.

The last activity of the program is a poster session on TAMU College Station campus, by the end of August.

Expected Outcomes

- Learn the principals and/or the basics of research.
- Collaborate with international faculty and students.
- Develop a global mindset related to their engineering careers.
- Be immersed in a different culture.
- Receive the basic tools to prepare them for future research opportunities.
- Develop a research proposal and a poster to be presented at the end of the program.

Eligibility Requirements for all participants and scolarship aplicants

- Be a regular UPY student.
- Have an OK academic & administrative status.
- B2 English profiency level or higher.
- Compose a research proposal related with a problem of Yucatán that could be solved by technology applications, and a letter of intent.
- General Average of 8.5 or higher until the January April term.
